## **CITAVI**


If I open an attached pdf in Endnote, can I work with citavi coding and have it linked to citavi from there? Or must I have separate pdfs for citavi?

EndNote stores all pdf files in a specific EndNote folder. If you use a local Citavi project, you can **link** to the pdf file in the EndNote folder, but beware that if anything happens to that folder, Citavi will not be able to see the file anymore.

What language should the PDF be to be supported by Citavi? Any language.

## How could the information layers be shared with co-authors?

You can share your Citavi project by inviting them to your cloud project, but in that case, they will need a license, too. You could also export the colours of the layers into a separate PDF file, but please note that this will only export the colours, underlining the text in the PDF file, but it will not export any text in the connected knowledge items (direct quotation, indirect quotation, comment, etc.).



Is this just for articles or can you use it for ebooks?

You can also use Citavi for ebooks.

Is it possible to link Citavi with another Reference Manager, e.g. Mendeley?

No, sorry, but you can export <-> import between them.
